## GUIDELINES FOR PILGRIM FELLOWSHIP EVENTS

We're glad you are thinking about joining us at the next Pilgrim Fellowship event. Listed below are some things you need to know that will make your retreat more enjoyable. The following guidelines are used at all state events.

Please remember you are attending a Christian Church youth function – WWJD?

- ❖ ❖ No one is to leave the activities or church area without permission of the chairperson of the MI. Youth Commission, Michelle Simino.
- ❖ ❖ Cars are not to be driven without permission of the chairperson.
- ❖ ❖ Everyone should be at the planned activities and not off by himself/herself.
- ❖ ❖ **No one is to be drinking alcohol at the activities or come after having been drinking. This applies to the use of drugs as well. Local authorities will be notified.**
- ❖ ❖ Host church's property is to be respected. The person causing any damage will pay for it.
- ❖ ❖ Host church's rules must be obeyed at all times. Please use common sense.
  
- ❖ ❖ Dress should be appropriate for all activities including church service Sunday morning.
  - ➤ No revealing clothing.
  - ➤ Swimsuits should be modest.
  - ➤ **Girls:** Please no midriffs showing, low cut tops or bottoms, or spaghetti straps.
    - ▪ Tank straps must be 2 finger widths wide.
    - ▪ Shorts/Skorts/Skirts must be fingertip length or longer.
  - ➤ **Boys:** Please no underwear showing – “sags” - or muscle shirts.
  - ➤ For Church Service: coats and ties/dresses are not necessary, but tee-shirts are not appropriate. **No jeans**, hats or bandanas. (Camp is an exception)
  
- ❖ ❖ Keep out of sleeping area of opposite sex.
- ❖ ❖ Any drug/alcohol /sex/blatant disobedience or other broken rules are a reason to be sent home immediately, at the offender's expense, by decision of the Youth Commission

It is not our intention, by developing these guidelines, to limit the fun at any of the state sponsored events. As a matter of fact, we feel that by having these guidelines known before an event, we can eliminate problems which could spoil the event for everyone.

Probably the most important guideline for all is to use common sense during the event. If we all use common sense and remember what type of activity we are attending, we should not have any problems.
